FREEDOM BY PASTOR MATTHEW STULTZ

For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery

(Galatians 5:1)

Throughout Lent we have been considering the ways that we are captive to fear. We've considered the fear of being alone, the fear of having done something that cannot be fixed, the fear of a meaningless life, the fear of not having enough, the fear that you'll be broken forever, the fear of the world, and the fear of death. These are not the fears that trap us all at once, but the fears that we all experience regardless of our station in life.

The apostle Paul encourages the church in Galatia to claim their freedom in Christ. He reminds them that the sin, the fear that had kept them from living a life of abundance, like Jesus promises, can no longer rule them.

So, I'm wondering how it is for you? Now that you've been reminded of the things we all fear and the ways Jesus and our faith community can help us see things in a more healthy, hopeful, and even joyful way, what will you do differently? Will you find the courage to love people that Jesus loves but that previously you struggled to care for? Will you spend more time loving God and learning how to connect with God on a deeper level? Will you be more gracious to yourself, knowing that God's grace given freely to you in Jesus Christ is a gift meant to reengage you into your life, to love and to be loved?

As we wrap up this series and we celebrate the Easter feast, let's spend some time in the darkness of late Thursday and Good Friday to remember what we have been afraid of, to name it, to learn from it and to step boldly in a new life filled with love and freedom.

The word hospitality can be found in Romans 12:13; 1 Timothy 5:10; Hebrews 13:2; and 1 Peter 4:9. Logan Murphy, in The What and Why of Biblical Hospitality, states that these verses show that hospitality is both action and affection, receiving and loving a stranger. Anyone can do acts of hospitality, the outward dimension. But there is an inner dimension of hospitality that requires a change of heart. 1 Peter 4:9 says we are to show hospitality to one another without grumbling. If we grumble or complain while doing acts of hospitality, we have not truly shown biblical hospitality.

If you live in Franklin Township, you have most likely heard of God's Bounty.

God's Bounty is a not-for-profit food pantry that provides food to

families in need in Franklin Township and the surrounding area.

The Franklin Township Ministerial Association saw a need in their community and in the fall of 2010, the area churches came together and began work. The parsonage of New Bethel Baptist Church was

the site chosen for the food pantry. A wall was taken down, shelves were built and stocked, furniture was donated, freezers and refrigerators were brought in and by February 3, 2011, the doors of God's Bounty were open and ready.

On Thursdays, the pantry serves about

75 families in Franklin Township and the surrounding area. Each involved church takes a week each month to supply volunteers that sort, pack, and hand out food. AUMC's week is the third Thursday. Last year, just on our weeks, we serviced over 900 families.

Can we count on you?

- Please pray for the work of God's Bounty and for the families they help.
- Pick up a few items when you go to the grocery. Leave them at the God's Bounty display in the Narthex and Missions will take them to the pantry. Red Food Pantry bags are available to help you remember.
- Encourage a group you are involved in to have a food drive for the pantry.
- Volunteer at the pantry. There are many jobs
 - including stocking shelves, filling orders, serving as an advocate, and buying groceries.
 - **Monetary donations** are greatly appreciated to help pay for utilities and to purchase items that are in short supply.
 - Sign up to participate in the

Kroger Rewards Program. It doesn't cost you anything and if you connect your Kroger Plus card to Acton UMC (#1011) on-line, the money raised goes to God's Bounty.

AUMC is collecting food for God's Bounty throughout April.

Any food donations brought in by April 23rd will be given to the scout troops for their Scouting for Food drive.
