## A WORD FROM PASTOR MATTHEW

*They drink their fill of the abundance of Your house;  
And You give them to drink of the river of Your delights.  
For with You is the fountain of life;  
In Your light we see light. Psalm 36:8-9*

In the ancient world, Egyptians, Greeks, and later Romans were experts in finding water and diverting its flow to the crops. Ancient people knew how important water really was, not for greener lawns or a few extra summer tomatoes, but for living; for life.


I've often thought the very image of the church should be a fountain. The Psalmist teaches us that God is the fountain of life and although we can find God anywhere in creation, there is a special and distinct connection in Christian community—the Church. Fountains are beautiful displays of life and joy. Ever see the water display set to music at Pigeon Forge? It's a sight to see!

In a fountain there must be a pump that takes water from a lower basin and brings it up into the air, then collects it into the basin to begin the process again. If there is no way to take the water from the basin, there will be no display, no water coming up in visual celebration. If there is no basin, the water display will fall to dry ground, only to dry up and cease the flow of water.

That is the Church. The basin is everything we do together to love and heal, the inclusion of new folks into ministries of nurture and care as well as equipping one another for service. The display is mission and simple acts of kindness, living out our faith. We cannot have one without the other. If we only care of ourselves, there will be no growth or new ideas, no outward display of God's love in the community. If we only hold celebrations and do mission work but don't care for one another and learn together, we will eventually die off.

How are we doing as a healthy fountain of God's love? How are we caring for one another and learning for more effective Christian lives as individuals and as a community? How are we displaying the love of Jesus in our community? How do others see this church? As a building only? We need balance.

So as summer draws to a close, consider how we can be refreshed by new ideas, new opportunities to care for each other and reach into the world with the love of Jesus. When a church is an effective fountain of the love of Christ, many will come to see, and with radical welcome, feel at home.



### The Sacraments

United Methodists recognize only those sacraments in which Jesus Christ Himself participated.

*Baptism* is the sacrament of initiation that joins us with the church and with Christians everywhere. It's a symbol of new life and a promise of God's saving love...and a sign of God's forgiveness for our sins. United Methodist baptize by sprinkling, immersion or pouring.

*The Lord's Supper* is a holy meal of bread and wine that symbolizes the body and blood of Christ. By sharing this meal, United Methodists give thanks for Jesus' sacrifice for our sins and receive grace to empower us to go on in Christian living.
