# From the pastor's desk



## Letting Grief Have It's Moment BY PASTOR MATTHEW STULTZ

I've noticed a theme in some of the major commercials of the holiday season and that is "moving on." There is a grocery store advertisement where an elderly man stumbles upon the recipe book of his departed wife and in running to the store and gathering ingredients, along with some help from his granddaughter, seems to bring the memories back to the forefront. His sadness dissipates as he has recreated her famous pie.

There's another one that is similar where a man, this

time not in a cartoon form, is frantically cooking dinner with his mother looking on she seems concerned that everything seems to be burning but says nothing. He gets everything to the table, and everyone seems happy and then

the camera pans up to her picture over the fireplace.

Commercials are reminding us that many families are missing loved ones this season. Over one million Americans died of covid related complications in addition to the other causes of death. That makes for an impact that is felt and shapes how families approach the holidays.

I know that many of you are grieving from a recent loss and I know that this time of year can truly bring forward feelings of grief that you've not felt for months or longer. It's natural to try and move on, press forward and try not to experience the sadness. We tell ourselves that when the loss took place we cried enough, no need to keep at it now.

That's not the way grief works. "Moving on" needs to happen but we never get over grief. It just changes and the sharp edge dulls over time. Grief is like the small child that is constantly yelling for our attention, "look at me, watch me, see me!" Until you give it recognition, it will continue to pester you in uncomfortable moments until you concede and

acknowledge that there is still grief in your heart.

Tuesday December 20<sup>th</sup> at 7pm we will gather in the sanctuary and give attention to that grief, let it have its moment. There may be

tears, and that's okay. There may be smiles, and that's okay. We will pause because it doesn't feel right to just "move on." We will stop and wait for Jesus, the light of the world. We are on the edge of the longest night of the year, but we know darkness cannot overcome the light.

So if this season doesn't feel as joyful as you'd like because you are experiencing anxious feelings, frustration with life, and especially grief, let's name these things in Jesus' name and be with one another for the journey.



Everyone needs renewal, even the most committed among us. The spiritual life requires regular practice and a bit of time. *Coming Alive: Daily Meditations for Spiritual Renewal* helps with developing a spiritual practice for seriousminded and busy, people. The study offers five brief mediations each week for focused reading, reflection, and prayer. Each entry centers on a passage of scripture or spiritual writing. The meditations are deep, insightful, and beautifully simple. This timeless book offers a gently challenging daily habit, which leads to renewal of spirit and mind. Readings take about 10 minutes a day and are undated so you can determine your own pattern of practice.


