A WORD FROM PASTOR MATTHEW

For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," Jeremiah 29:11-14

We are just starting to get settled in the new year and it is ahead of us with many possibilities. Although the past 2 years have been anything but enjoyable, they have not been void of joy. So while we are still at the beginning, I'd like to share a few things that as a church we can do to make our congregation a place of spiritual growth, care, and outreach.

How are you doing with our congregational book, *We Make the Road by Walking*? I chose this book to help us reorient ourselves into the Christian tradition smack dab in the middle of Neo-orthodox theology; the basics. This is an excellent opportunity for us to journey together and refresh our hearts with the basics of our Christian faith. If this book isn't doing it for you, do not neglect this opportunity to begin a new prayer life. I'd be honored to help design a specific plan for you that works with your personality and schedule. Doing these things together will make our church better, more biblically aware and focused on Christ.

I have a confession to make: My memory is limited. I wish I had a state-of-the-art hard drive installed in my head that made it possible for me to remember every word anyone ever says to me. If you share something with me on a Sunday morning, please know that if it is not written down somewhere else, I'll probably forget. Even if it is the most important thing in your life at that moment, chances are, I'll forget. Am I that calloused? By no means! I simply have my head filled with leading worship, leading the singing, preaching, sometimes a children's moment, paying attention to the technology cues, and then teaching a lesson to our high school class immediately after worship. I'm also probably trying my best to remember the thing that someone ahead of you just shared. So yes, please share with me what is going on, but please make sure and help me out by writing it down, emailing the church office, or putting a confidential prayer card in the offering plate after service.

These are difficult times all around and we are all emotionally taxed. If you find yourself in need to just vent, to just be heard, please let's make an appointment to have a confidential conversation. You can contact me directly or through the church office to schedule a time.

So as 2022 begins, let's make a commitment to grow in faith by study, clearly communicate with one another to lift one another up, and continue to seek opportunities to serve others. I pray that this year is one of health and many blessings. As my mentor Rev. Jack Scott often says, "May God bless you real good." In Christ,






