A WORD FROM PASTOR MATTHEW

But dust...

We begin the holy season of Lent this month, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd. In the liturgy, we are reminded that our entire mortal identity is “but dust” and nothing more. In truth, that is the most that we as human beings can hope for on our own, dust.

The giggles of my adolescent self when hearing “but dust” aside, it is an essential reality for us to remember. In Christ we have hope of resurrection, but on our own we have dust. Not many of us challenge this, although we may sometimes doubt. Yet times arise in our lives when we think we know better than God or we are too afraid to trust that God has it all under control.

When we are afraid it is easy to see others as threats or “less than” they are meant to be. In Christ, we are taught time and again that we are to take God’s eyes to see others; instead of enemies to see partners, instead of impoverished to see ourselves, instead of threats to see opportunities for understanding. To receive God’s vision, to live fully in this world we must come to terms with our own power, that we have none. It is by the grace of God that we draw breath and the love of God that we know our worth.

We are special to God, so very special that although our destiny is to return to this universe as the same dust from which we were made, God does not make that the end of our story. By the love of God through Jesus Christ we can hope for more and we are promised more. But first we must relinquish the illusion of control over our own lives and remember what we are without God. That way, we might take to heart the lesson Lent has for us: Turn back to God. Stop trying to do it on your own and take the hand of Christ.

May this season grant you the opportunity for inward exploration, to know you are loved, and to know you are not alone.

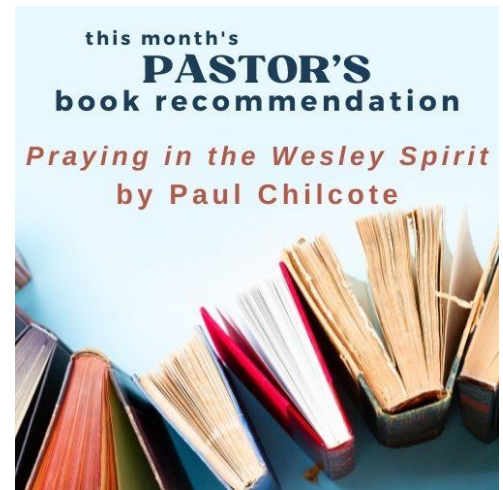

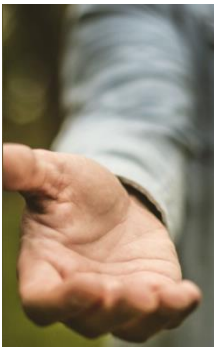

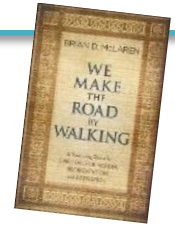

A BIG SCOUT THANK YOU to the church and all its parishioners for all the support provided to our Troops and the other scouting troops the church hosts within its walls. We wouldn't be able to do what we do without the hospitality of our AUMC family providing a meeting space and helping scouts with/at its functions like Eagle Dinners, Bake Sales, Scouting for Food, and Scout Sunday. Our scouting programs are designed to help our youth develop life skills, self-confidence, ethics, leadership skills, and citizenship skills that will influence them well into their adult lives. And most importantly, by being chartered by AUMC, it gives them an opportunity to develop their spiritual growth! This one hit home for me with my own kids.

As Pastor Matthew so very well stated at the Scout Sunday Service a few weeks back, these programs plant seeds to help our youth through these formative years. By your support, our units are able to water those seeds! Troop 219 recently had 5-6 scouts join our ranks since the start of the year and Troop 104 just had 15 scouts crossover into its Troop this past weekend. Given such, last night's weekly meeting attendance counts were 15 for Troop 219 and 45 for Troop 104! That is 60 young adults (ages 11-17) just on a recent Monday night being reached. There are about 70 scouts between the two troops. So, I just want to reiterate that we appreciate all the support and say thank you!

SERVING OTHERS IN THE NAME OF CHRIST

UMCOR SUNDAY – MARCH 27th

Each year the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) makes an appeal for donations to support their administrative cost. This allows all other donations collected during the year to go directly toward mission efforts. UMCOR funds are used to assist with disaster relief both in our country and around the world.

ROBERTS PARK UMC COMMUNITY MEAL – HELP NEEDED

Soup's On is a ministry of the Roberts Park UMC located downtown on Delaware. Since 1999, they have prepared and served 150,000 meals to their neighbors in need. Prior to COVID, hot meals were provided every Sunday in the Church basement. For the last two years, Robert's Park UMC has been providing about 100 "to go" sack lunches on Sundays from 11:00 to 12:00. This year Acton will be assisting by providing sack lunches on two Sundays - June 26th and December 25th. Our Men's Saturday Morning Bible Study are taking care of June 26th. We are looking for individuals who would like to assist on December 25th. Sack lunches will be assembled on the Saturday prior. If you think you might like to help, please contact the church office.

AFGHANISTAN REFUGEES UPDATE

Missions will not be collecting for the Afghanistan Refugees since they are no longer being housed at Camp Atterbury. Afghanistan Refugees are being resettled in Indiana cities including Muncie, Bloomington, and Indianapolis. As a result of being resettled in local communities, the needs have changed. If you wish to aid with the refugee resettlement, please contact the Exodus Refugee organization located in Indianapolis. Exodus is assisting with resettlement. Their website also has information on how you can help and needed household items. (exodusrefugee.org.) Thanks to all who participated in providing needed items while refugees were located at Camp Atterbury.

SAVE THE CHILDREN UKRAINE CRISIS RELIEF FUND

Acton UMC is donating \$2,000 to [Save the Children Ukraine Crisis Relief Fund](#). According to their website, Save the Children is providing children and families with immediate aid, such as food, water, hygiene kits, psychosocial support, and cash assistance. This 100-year-old organization was recommended by Charity Navigator, a charity review organization, as one of nine programs recommended in providing assistance to Ukraine.

CHILI COOK-OFF WINNERS

Impossible Vegetarian Chili – Dave Spicer

1 lb. - Impossible Ground Beef
 6 ct. - Mini Multicolored Peppers
 1 can - Mild Chili and Diced Tomatoes
 1 can - Bush's Mild Chili Beans (gluten free, vegetarian)
 1 can - Bush's Hot Chili Beans (gluten free, vegetarian)
 1 can - 46 oz. Tomato Juice (make sure not from concentrate as it may have wheat added)
 1 box - 8oz. Banza Elbows (I prefer Barilla GF noodles, but Kroger hasn't had them in months)
 Spices - (never measured always to taste)
 Salt and Pepper
 Chili powder (I love generic versions that don't have MSG or wheat added as those do exist)
 Cayenne Powder
 Crushed Red Pepper
 Dried onion flakes (these do the least amount of damage to my system while providing the flavor I enjoy)
 Tools: 1 Stock Pot, 1 Saucepan, 1 Spatula, 1 Slotted Spoon, I cook everything on high so timing is a thing...
 Step 1 - Start water boiling for noodles in saucepan.
 Step 2 - Place cube of ground impossible burger in stock pot.
 Step 3 - Layer all spices across the cube about enough to change the color with each spice.
 Step 4 - Cut all the peppers, open all the cans.
 Step 5 - The bottom should be ready to chop up the burger and brown, do not drain (it has no grease, that's extra flavor).
 Step 6 - Add all the things (except noodles) to the stock pot.
 Step 7 - Layer the spices to taste.
 Step 8 - Cook, drain then add the noodles.
 Should be ready in a total time of about 30 minutes. The noodles take the most time of this recipe. I suggest adding cheese and sour cream to each bowl served. Good times!

Mom's Favorite Chili – Adam Clark

Ingredients:

- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 medium yellow onion -diced
- 2 celery stocks - diced
- 1 pound 90% lean ground beef
- 2 ½ tablespoons chili powder
- 2 tablespoons ground cumin
- 2 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 tablespoon garlic powder
- 1 ½ teaspoons salt
- ½ teaspoon ground black pepper
- ¼ teaspoon ground cayenne pepper* -optional
- 1 ½ cups beef broth
- 1 (15 oz.) can petite diced tomatoes – don't drain
- 1 (16 oz.) can red kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 (8 oz.) can tomato sauce

Instructions:

- Heat olive in a large soup pot.
- Add ¾ chopped onion and cook for 5 minutes.
- Add ground beef and break it apart with a wooden spoon.
- Cook for 6-7 minutes.
- Add chili powder, cumin, sugar, tomato paste, garlic powder, salt, pepper, and optional cayenne.
- Stir until well combined.
- Add diced tomatoes (with juice), kidney beans, beef broth, celery, tomato sauce, and the rest of the onion.
- Stir well.
- Simmer for 20-25 minutes.
- Let the chili rest for 5-10 minutes before serving.

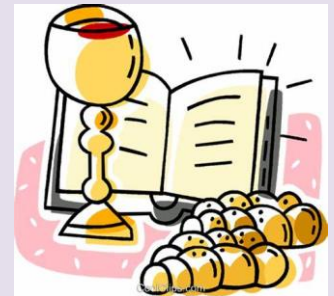

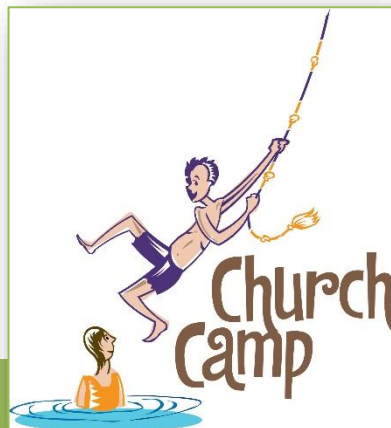
