# From the pastor's desk



## Culture

*Do you not know that in a race the runners all compete, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win it. Athletes exercise self-control in all things; they do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable one.*

(1 Corinthians 9:24-25)

At the end of this month, on the 28<sup>th</sup>, the greatest spectacle of racing will take place: The Indianapolis 500. In some way it is part of our DNA in the Hoosier state, whether or not we have ever driven a race car or attended the 500 in person. It is something talked about, and you simply cannot miss the signs that the race is coming.

Paul writes to the church in Corinth using an analogy that they were all familiar with. We know the Olympics are an ancient form of athletic competition and that the Olympic flame is carried by athletes from Athens, Greece to wherever the competition is taking place. Corinth is a city in Greece and the culture of the race is the culture of everyone in that area. Little kids would run in the streets and wear laurel crowns to proclaim the winner, much like a farm kid in Hendricks County is shooting hoops right now. Our culture and heritage define us.

What Paul is trying to convey to the Corinthians is that we should use the same passion in our discipleship to Jesus Christ as we do to our cultural practices. We all have interests and things that we enjoy, but how much time do we spend on our hobbies versus our faith?

A driver that only attends a team meeting for an hour each week but never practices, never works on aerodynamics, never even qualifies, will he or she race on Memorial Day Weekend?

We need to show up for our faith, not just on Sunday mornings, but each day, focused like a runner, like a driver preparing for the big race, may we show up and *do all the good that we can, to all the people that we can, as long as ever we can*, effectively loving and serving as we go.

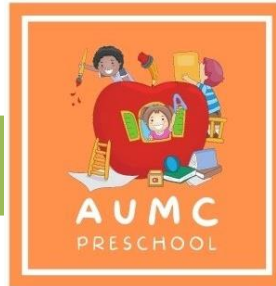
**MAY IS ARTHRITIS

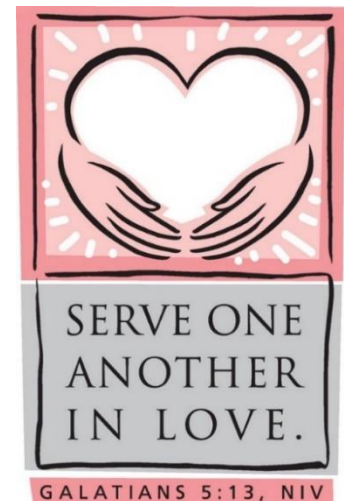
