A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

We are nearing the Fall season and nothing is normal. We just celebrated the Indy 500 in August, college football will be played with a handful of teams (as I write this, it probably changed when you are reading this) and church is happening in a scattered fashion.

The early church met in homes in small groups while sharing a meal. The mission of the early church was simply to continue to share the Good News, take care of the poor, and be a source of encouragement and strength for one another. While I am thankful for our scouting ministry and our preschool (and many other people who utilize the facility) I cannot help but wonder how we can get back to basics. What does it look like for us to live like the early church during this transition out of a pandemic?

How do we encourage one another? We continue to meet in small groups responsibly and fellowship and learn; we also pray.

2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against, and
3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side."

WE CONTINUE TO MOVE FORWARD and are looking towards a time when we are all together again and worshiping in the sanctuary. In the mean time, the Congregational Council continues to monitor mandates and meet to move us towards that goal.

Facemasks will continue to be required if you are inside the building for all adults (children should follow the FTCS standards based on age.) When outside, you are welcome to remove your face covering after you are greater than 6 feet apart from someone not in your household.

The current Indiana mandate has been extended to September 25th. AUMC will continue the mask mandate for two weeks past the final state mandate to play it safe. Should an increase in cases occur from the lifting of the mandate, this would give us a safe buffer to assure our congregation's safety. As long as things progress, after that two weeks we would move to a mask if you choose in the sanctuary but worship will still be in the shortened format.

After that two weeks is over, we will move forward to a full and regular worship service with hymns and optional masks.

We have added the singing of "Go Now in Peace" in the sanctuary with masks ON. We feel the increased risk is minimal and it is important to sing a little bit during worship, but to do so safely. Should you be uncomfortable with this, please feel free to leave before we sing or as we start singing.

We will continue our YouTube Live stream as well as the Windshield Worship regardless of any changes in the sanctuary.

These are not ideal circumstances but we feel the decisions mirror a care for our congregation and community while also making room to hopefully get back to full participation inside the facility. This policy passed with full consensus among all board members.

THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU! These words cannot begin to explain the gratitude that Josette & I feel towards the people of our church. Since I began my adventure, we have been overwhelmed by the outpouring of prayers, the deluge of cards we have received.

We have received multiple dinners, with offers of others. No wonder our church is noted for having so many great cooks. I have no doubt that the well wishes, prayers, concerns have had an impact on where I currently am in my rehab. I have a visiting nurse come to the house a couple times a week. On Monday, 8/24 I had my first follow up with cardiology group. They were quite pleased with my progress. On 8/25, I had a follow up with primary care doctor, and she also was pleased with my progress. I am currently doing more walking, trying to regain some of my stamina. My next appointment is 9/9 with surgeon who performed surgery. They have recommended me for cardiac re-hab, so hopefully that will be my next adventure.

In closing, I would like to say, how lucky we are, to be in a church with so many compassionate caring, loving persons. I cannot believe there is another church in our area that has that type of congregation.

- Be healthy
- Bring picture I.D

1 in 7 people entering the hospital will need a blood transfusion
